# ATPI Alerts Travel Restrictions per Country due to Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

Countries all over the world are implementing travel bans and restrictions in an effort to limit the spread of the COVID pandemic outbreak. Below you may find the most recent updates in short. Note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines <u>status may change at any given time</u> without prior notice. The enlisted information are based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

## Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

#### **EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:**

- 1. Bulgaria, UK: Update: Bulgaria Air will resume flights on Sofia-London route from 1 May
- 2. Slovenia: Update: Public transport will be restarted from 11 May, government spokesperson says
- Lithuania: Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports quarantine is still active with some restrictions lifted, updates its information on flights and ferries. The Government of Lithuania is examining resumption of flights to Warsaw, Frankfurt and Copenhagen starting the week of May 11.
- 4. Greece: Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports gradual re-opening of country will start on 4 May

#### **ASIAN /AUSTRALIA COUNTRIES:**

- Guam, Northern Marianas: Update: United Airlines will resume flights between Guam, Saipan on 2
   May
- 6. **Malaysia:** Update: Government to allow most businesses to reopen starting on 4 May as COVID-19 outbreak eases

#### **AFRICAN / MIDDLE EAST COUNTRIES:**

- Namibia: Update: Government will start to ease nationwide restrictions on movement from 5 May;
   borders will remain closed
- 8. United Arab Emirates: Update: Emirates airline to offer limited passenger services from 2 May

### Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

1. **Bosnia and Herzegovina**: Update: Government extends halt to all passenger air traffic until June to curb spread of COVID-19

#### **AIRLINES:**

- 2. **South Africa**: Update: Comair expects to remain grounded until at least October because of COVID-19 outbreak
- 3. **Europe**: Update: Ryanair to ground nearly all of its flights until July because of low demand in wake of COVID-19 pandemic
