## ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

#### Dear Valued Client,

Countries all over the world are implementing travel bans and restrictions in an effort to limit the spread of the COVID pandemic outbreak. Below you may find the most recent updates in short. Note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines <u>status may change at any given time</u> without prior notice. The enlisted information are based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

## Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

#### **EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:**

- 1. Kazakhstan, Turkey: Update: Flights between countries may resume in late June amid COVID-19 pandemic
- 2. Europe: Update: Cyprus will reopen its airports for flights from 19 countries from 9 June; hotels to reopen on 1 June
- 3. Spain: Update: Government will reopen to international tourism from July
- 4. **Turkey:** Update: Government to resume some train services as it gradually eases partial COVID-19 lockdown
- 5. Hungary, Serbia: Update: Border between countries reopens for local citizens after COVID-19 prompts closure

#### ASIAN /AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- 6. India: Hyderabad's Rajiv Gandhi International Airport will resume flight operations from 25 May after suspension because of COVID-19
- 7. India: Update: Domestic flights to resume 25 May

8. Iran: Update: Government announces further relaxation of COVID-19 lockdown measures

#### **AMERICAN COUNTRIES:**

**9.** Ecuador: Update: Some 30 percent of passenger flights to resume on 1 June amid COVID-19 pandemic

#### AFRICAN / MIDDLE EAST COUNTRIES:

**10. South Africa:** Update: Government will further ease COVID-19 lockdown restrictions from 1 June

#### **AIRLINES:**

- 11. India: Update: SpiceJet to resume operations from 25 May after COVID-19 prompts suspension
- **12.** Europe: Update: **Luxair** to resume regular passenger flights between Luxembourg and Stockholm, Lisbon, Porto, Hamburg and Munich on 29 May after COVID-19 prompts suspension
- **13.** U.K.: Update: **Jet2** to resume flights from 1 July after COVID-19 forces suspension
- **14.** Europe: **Belavia Belarusian Airlines** will operate flights between Armenia, Belarus and Spain starting 2 June amid COVID-19 outbreak
- **15.** India: Update: **GoAir** expected to resume domestic flights from 1 June because of 'operational and regulatory issues' after COVID-19 travel restrictions eased
- **16.** Europe: Update: **Montenegro Airlines** expected to resume some commercial flights from early June following COVID-19 suspension
- **17.** Germany: Update: **Lufthansa** will resume flights to 20 destinations from mid-June after COVID-19 suspension
- 18. Caribbean: Air Antilles, Air Caraïbes resume regional flights amid COVID-19 pandemic

## Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

- U.K.: Update: Government to introduce 14-day quarantine for almost all international travelers from 8 June because of COVID-19
- 2. Peru: Update: Nationwide COVID-19 lockdown extended until 30 June
- **3. Greece**: Update: Government extends suspension of flights to several countries because of COVID-19 (including the Netherlands)
- 4. Barbados: Seawell's Grantley Adams Airport to remain closed to commercial traffic until 30 June because of COVID-19 outbreak
- 5. Argentina: Update: COVID-19 lockdown in Buenos Aires extended to 7 June

#### AIRLINES:

6. Europe: Update: Wizz Air suspends all flights in its **Polish network** until 6 June after government extends COVID-19 travel restrictions
