ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

Countries all over the world are implementing travel bans and restrictions in an effort to limit the spread of the COVID pandemic outbreak. Below you may find the most recent updates in short. Note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines <u>status may change at any given time</u> without prior notice. The enlisted information are based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Extra Thalys rail service announcement:

Up and including Monday June 8th two rail services per day will be operational between Brussels South and Paris Nord.

Between June 9th and Saturday July 11tyh the following Thalys services will be put in operation: Amsterdam and Paris Nord Paris Nord and Amsterdam Dortmund and Paris Nord, daily from June 15th Paris Nord and Dortmund, daily from June 15th Brussels-South and Paris Nord Paris Nord en Brussels-South

Between July 12th and August 29th the Thalys will be servicing several routes and frequencies, please ask your Travel Consultant for more information.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

Europe, U.S.: Update: Scandinavian Airlines will resume some of its suspended flights in first half of June

Georgia: Update: Government will restart public transport, reopen shops before 8 June.

Germany: <u>Update</u>: Government to lift travel warning against 26 EU countries from 15 June.

North Macedonia: <u>Security Message</u>: U.S. Embassy reports COVID-19 related curfew, other restrictions lifted; social distancing still required.

ASIAN /AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

Japan: <u>Security Message</u>: U.S. Mission reports nationwide state of emergency has been lifted, international travel and other restrictions continue.

Oman: Update: COVID-19 lockdown of Muscat governorate will end on 29 May.

Sri Lanka: <u>Update</u>: International airport may re-open for foreign tourists from 1 August.

India: <u>Update</u>: Domestic flight operations set to begin at Kolkata airport on 28 May.

Saudi Arabia: Flynas to resume some domestic flights from 31 May.

Americas

Canada, **U.S.**: <u>Update</u>: Air Canada to resume flights to, from United States after suspension because of COVID-19 outbreak.

U.S.: <u>Update</u>: Spirit Airlines to resume flights from Charleston's Yeager Airport to Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, from 2 July.

Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

U.K.: British Airways cancels all flights from Leeds Bradford Airport to London Heathrow because of COVID-19.

U.S.: Flights suspended at Paine Field Airport in Snohomish, Washington, until 1 August for works

Russia: Update: Mayor of Moscow extends self-isolation until 14 June, lifts some COVID-19 restrictions

South Africa: <u>Update</u>: Administrators at South African Airways deny domestic flights set to resume from mid-June, rejecting earlier statement.

Montenegro, **Serbia**: Serbian government bans inbound flights by Montenegro Airlines following Montenegrin government's refusal to reopen border.

Indonesia: <u>Update</u>: Lion Air Group will temporarily suspend all domestic flight operations for five days amid passenger confusion.

Switzerland: Flights regulated, delays expected in Zurich Airport's 'manoeuvring area'.

U.K.: <u>Security Message</u>: U.S. Embassy updates its COVID-19 information, reports 14-day self-isolation for new arrivals.

Guinea-Bissau, Senegal: Security Message: U.S. Embassy updates its information on COVID-19 restrictions.

Brazil: <u>Security Message</u>: U.S. Embassy reports extension of country's border closures.

Australia: <u>Security Message</u>: U.S. Embassy advises travelers to visit state and territory websites for COVID-19 restrictions.

Chile: <u>Security Message</u>: U.S. Embassy reports changes in quarantine measures.

Thailand: <u>Security Message</u>: U.S. Embassy reports Royal Government extends national state emergency until 30 June.
