## ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

Countries all over the world are implementing travel bans and restrictions in an effort to limit the spread of the COVID pandemic outbreak. Below you may find the most recent updates in short. Note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines status may change at any given time without prior notice. The enlisted information are based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

### **General Important Notes:**

- Anyone arriving into the UK from 8th June will need to complete the form in following link. Failure to do so may result in a fine: <https://www.gov.uk/provide-journey-contact-details-before-travel-uk>.
- Own face coverings / masks will be required across all airports and flights, to comply with COVID-19 measures.
- It is strongly advised to arrive as early as possible to the airport for your departure.
- Airlines have their own policies which are being updated regularly and can be checked directly on their respective websites.
- For the latest information about local country restrictions we advise to check the website of Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

## Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

### **EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:**

- **Germany:** Update: Lufthansa to offer passengers 'return-flight guarantee' amid COVID-19 pandemic.

### **AFRIKA:**

- **Somalia:** Update: Domestic flights to resume 8 June.

### **MIDDLE EAST:**

- **Israel:** Update: Resumption of railway traffic postponed because of virus fears; no new date set.

### AMERICAS:

- China, **U.S.:** Update: U.S. government will allow limited flights by Chinese airlines.
- **Honduras:** Update: Curfew extended to 14 June amid COVID-19 pandemic.
- **Canada:** Update: Prince Rupert Airport to resume flight operations from 22 June after COVID-19 prompts suspension.

### ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- **Georgia:** Update: Country's airspace to reopen to international flights on 1 July after COVID-19 prompts closure.
- **Kyrgyz Republic:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports limited commercial air service set to resume this month, reissues its COVID-19 information.
- **Thailand:** Update: Aviation Authority allows seven more domestic airports to resume flight operations.
- **Malaysia:** Update: Government to allow interstate travel from 10 June; ease COVID-19 restrictions.

### AIRLINES:

- Asia, U.K., U.S.: Update: **Virgin Atlantic** to resume some passenger flights in July after COVID-19 forces suspension
- Belgium: Update: **Ryanair** to resume flights to, from Brussels starting 1 July as COVID-19 concerns ease.
- Africa, Europe, U.S.: Update: **Brussels Airlines** releases list of resuming flight services starting 15 July as COVID-19 concerns ease.
- Europe: Update: **Air Malta** to resume flights to several European countries from 1 July.
- Egypt, Europe: Update: **EgyptAir** will operate special flights from Cairo to several European destinations in June.

## Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

- Croatia, United Arab Emirates: Update: **Emirates** postpones resumption of Dubai-Zagreb flights until 1 September.
- **Turks & Caicos:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports airports and seaports remain closed to regional and international flights until 22 July.
- **Lithuania:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports quarantine has been extended to 16 June, updates schedule of departing flights.
- **Netherlands:** Security Message: U.S. Consulate updates its information on COVID-19, reports travel ban from outside EU extended through 15 June.
- **Global:** Update: CDC continues to warn of nonessential international travel because of COVID-19.
- **Poland:** Update: Government to extend ban on international flights until 16 June because of COVID-19.
- **Bangladesh:** Update: Regular Biman Bangladesh Airlines flights remain canceled through 8 June because of lack of passengers.

- **U.S.:** Update: CTA buses, trains resume as Chicago area braces for another wave of demonstrations.
- **New Zealand:** Update: Prime minister lifts COVID-19 measures from 9 June; border closure restrictions to remain.
