ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines <u>status may change at any</u> <u>given time</u> without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

- Europe, Turkey: Pegasus Airlines to gradually resume some international flights from 13 June
- Greece: All international airports, border crossings to fully reopen on 1 July
- Lithuania: U.S. Embassy updates its information on flights and ferries, lifting of quarantine
- **Netherlands:** RIVM announces there is <u>no maximum</u> to the number of passengers on board an aircraft. A health check, mouth masks and a mandatory declaration of health will minimize risks
- UK: <u>Trains</u>: Find out about travelling safely and other coronavirus travel updates on the National Rail Enquiries website page. Please go at quieter times if you can. If possible, buy your ticket before getting to the station or use contactless, and check the latest information before you set off.
- **Bosnia and Herzegovina**: U.S. Embassy reports Sarajevo Airport is now open, updates its COVID-19 information
- **Romania:** U.S. Embassy reports extension of state of alert, relaxation of some COVID-19 restrictions
- **Georgia**: Government lifts 14-day quarantine for arrivals from 1 July; transit air traffic may remain restricted
- **Europe:** Poland reopens borders with Germany, Czech Republic and Slovakia, relaxes border controls with Lithuania
- France, Greece: Air France resumes flights to Athens, Heraklion from French regional airports from 6 July
- Czech Republic, Latvia: AirBaltic plans to resume direct flights from Prague to Riga on 27 July
- Greece: International flights into, out of Greece to resume on 15 June

• Europe: Spanish government will restart full EU travel on 21 June, 10 days earlier than initially planned; land border with Portugal will remain closed until 1 July

AFRICA:

• **Egypt:**_Update: Government will allow scheduled international flights, foreign tourists to some coastal areas from 1 July

MIDDLE EAST:

- Lebanon: Beirut's Rafic Hariri International Airport to reopen 1 July; air traffic will be kept at 10 percent capacity
- Saudi Arabia: Saudia will resume flights between Jeddah and Hail starting 15 June; international flights remain suspended until further notice

AMERICAS:

- Jamaica: U.S. Embassy reports borders to open 15 June
- Venezuela: Authorities extend COVID-19 lockdown until mid-July

ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- Australia: New South Wales, Victoria to further ease some public COVID-19 restrictions
- Uzbekistan: Government to reopen borders to some air travelers from 15 June
- Tajikistan: Government eases COVID-19 restrictions; borders, railways remain closed

AIRLINES:

• Europe, Turkey: Update: SunExpress restarts international flights between Turkey, several

Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

- China: Beijing upgrades COVID-19 risk warning, restricts travel and institutes mass testing after outbreak
- Hungary: U.S. Embassy updates, reissues its information concerning travel, COVID-19 restrictions
- Dominican Republic: State of emergency extended to 30 June
- Bangladesh, China: China Southern Airlines suspends Dhaka-Guangzhou flight service for four weeks from 22 June because of concerns about COVID-19 infections
- Marshall Islands: Ban on incoming travelers extended to 5 July amid ongoing COVID-19 concerns
- South Pacific: Solomon Airlines international flights to remain suspended until end of August because of COVID-19
- India: Limited train services resuming in Mumbai amid COVID-19 pandemic; only essential service personnel allowed to travel

 Kosovo: All flights canceled at Pristina International Airport on 15 June following increase in COVID-19 cases
