ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines status may change at any given time without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

- **Poland, Slovakia:** Update: Slovakian government to allow travel to Poland from 20 June as COVID-19 restrictions decrease
- **Europe:** Update: Passenger flights to resume at East Midlands Airport from 21 June
- **U.K.:** London City Airport resumes commercial flights after COVID-19 closure
- **Spain:** Update: Borders reopen to most European countries as state of emergency comes to an end; British tourists will be allowed in without having to quarantine
- **Albania:** Update: Tirana International Airport to resume all regular international flights on 22 June
- **Malta:** Update: Malta to open its borders to 18 European countries on 1 July and to other countries on 15 July
- **Cyprus, Lebanon:** Government of Cyprus allows flights from Lebanon
- **Netherlands:** Security Message: U.S. Consulate reports entrance restrictions for U.S. travelers, updates other COVID-19-related information, limited number of passport and visa services available again
- **Croatia:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy updates its information on entrance restrictions and flight availability

- **Hungary:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy updates, reissues its information on easing of COVID-19 restrictions
- **Romania:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports state of alert extended another 30 days, updates its information on COVID-19 restrictions. Effective June 17, the Government of Romania announced additional relaxation measures
- **Lithuania:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports nationwide quarantine ended, state of emergency still in effect

AFRICA:

- **Morocco:** Update: Government allows resumption of commercial flights, reopening of beaches and hotels on 24 June
- **Egypt:** Update: Some 266 hotels, resorts reopen in country after receiving hygiene safety certificates amid COVID-19 pandemic

MIDDLE EAST:

- **Saudi Arabia:** Update: Government to lift nationwide curfew from 21 June; international flights remain suspended

AMERICAS:

No updates

ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- **Japan:** Update: Government lifts domestic travel bans following COVID-19 concerns
- **Nepal:** Update: All domestic, international flights expected to resume from 1 August after COVID-19 prompts suspension
- **Pakistan:** Update: International passenger flights resuming in country after COVID-19 prompts suspension

AIRLINES:

- **Jordan:** Update: **Royal Jordanian, Jordan Aviation and Fly Jordan** restart passenger services at Aqaba's King Hussein International Airport
- **Indonesia:** **AirAsia Indonesia** gradually resumes international, domestic flights
- **Europe:** Update: **Air Serbia** plans to resume Belgrade-Oslo flights from 16 July, will increase services to Milan, Duesseldorf

Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

- **U.S.:** Governor of New York considering implementing quarantine for travelers from Florida, other states with high COVID-19 infection rates
- **Europe, Israel:** Update: **Bulgaria Air** extends suspension of flights to Tel Aviv, Lisbon, Moscow because of COVID-19 restrictions, resumes Sofia-Burgas flights from 29 June
- **Europe:** **LEVEL Europe** airline enters insolvency; flights grounded
- **Thailand:** Update: International flights expected to resume in September at the earliest
- **Kyrgyz Republic:** Government suspends public transport in Bishkek, closes routes between all provinces until 22 June following increase in COVID-19 cases

- **Azerbaijan:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports COVID-19 travel restrictions extended through 1 August
- **Costa Rica:** Update: Government halts reopening as COVID-19 cases increase
- **Ireland:** Update: Quarantine for those arriving from other countries extended to at least 9 July
- **Ukraine:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports COVID-19 quarantine extended until 31 July
- **Turkey:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports weekend curfews planned in all provinces on 20, 27, 28 June; those who had previously purchased intercity travel tickets will be exempt
- **Mexico:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy updates its information on COVID-19 restrictions
- **Asia: South Korean** government will restrict visas, flights for travelers from Pakistan, Bangladesh from 23 June following surge in imported COVID-19 cases
- **U.K., U.S.: Virgin Atlantic** suspends flights between Glasgow and Orlando until end of 2020
