ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines status may change at any given time without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

- **Europe:** Several airlines resumes flights at Faro Airport
- **Spain: Corvera Airport** to resume flights from 1 July
- **France:** Paris Orly Airport to reopen 26 June with limited operations

AFRICA:

- **No updates**

MIDDLE EAST:

- **Middle East** is open for tourists as of 7th July and residents and nationals can now travel.

AMERICAS:

- **Canada, U.K.:** Air Canada resumes flights between London and Toronto

- **Colombia:** COVID-19 lockdown measures extended until 15 July; international flights suspended until 31 August

ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- **Singapore, Taiwan:** Scoot to resume flights between Singapore and Taiwan from 5 July

AIRLINES:

- **Australia, China, South Korea, Sri Lanka:** SriLankan Airlines plans to resume flights to Australia, China, South Korea from 1 August
- **Morocco:** Air Arabia Maroc plans to resume domestic flights from 25 June
- **Netherlands, U.K.:** KLM to resume London-Amsterdam flights from 13 July
- **Greece, Spain, U.K.:** TUI to resume flights to some destinations in Greece, Spain from 11 July

Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

- **DR Congo:** U.S. Embassy advises that government has extended COVID-19 related State of Health of Emergency until 11 July
- **Dubai, Pakistan:** Emirates suspends flights from Pakistan after passengers test positive for COVID-19; Pakistan-bound flights still operating
- **Europe, U.S.:** European Union countries may bar U.S. travelers because of COVID-19 outbreak
- **Colombia:** COVID-19 lockdown measures extended until 15 July; international flights suspended until 31 August
- **Bulgaria:** Government to extend state of emergency until 15 July following recent increase in COVID-19 cases
- **Australia:** Regional Express threatens to cancel flights to Armidale as new security measures introduced
