ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines <u>status may change at any</u> <u>given time</u> without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

- North Macedonia: Skopje and Ohrid international airports will reopen for commercial traffic starting 1 July
- Kosovo: Update: Pristina International Airport to reopen on 28 June; government lifts suspension of air, land travel from some countries
- Poland, Ukraine: Update: Poland may resume flights to Ukraine in early July
- Ireland, Switzerland: Update: Flights from Cork Airport to Zurich to resume from 5 July
- U.K.: Commercial flights resume from Exeter Airport after suspension because of COVID-19

AFRICA:

MIDDLE EAST:

• Lebanon: Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports Rafic Hariri International Airport in Beirut to reopen to commercial air traffic on 1 July

AMERICAS:

• **Canada**: COVID-19 related restrictions will ease for residents in British Columbia, Northwest Territories, Nunavut on 1 July

ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- **Taiwan**: Taipei's Taoyuan International Airport partially reopens for international transit passengers starting 25 June
- **Asia, Europe**: Update: Uzbekistan transport authorities plan possible resumption of international regular flights to several countries from July

AIRLINES:

- Netherlands, U.K.: Update: KLM to resume London-Amsterdam flights from 13 July
- Congo: Trans Air Congo resumes domestic flights between Brazzaville and Point Noire
- United Arab Emirates: Update: Flydubai will begin to resume regular scheduled flights from 7 July
- Croatia, Qatar: Update: Qatar Airways to resume flights between Doha and Zagreb from 1 July
- **U.K.:** Update: **TUI** to resume flights from Manchester, Gatwick, Birmingham airports on 11 July and Glasgow Airport on 25 July
- Croatia, Germany: Update: Eurowings to resume more flights to Croatia from July
- Lebanon, Qatar: Update: Qatar Airways to resume daily flights to Beirut from 1 July
- Europe: Update: EasyJet to resume Paris, Barcelona and Milan flights from 1 July

Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

- **Pakistan, United Arab Emirates**: **Emirates** suspends flights from Pakistan after passengers test positive for COVID-19; Pakistan-bound flights still operating
- **Myanmar**: Official Travel Advice: U.K. warns against nonessential travel to some areas, advises travelers staying during COVID-19 outbreak
- **Cape Verde**: Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports international commercial flights remain suspended until August, updates its information concerning COVID-19 outbreak
- Lebanon: Official Travel Advice: U.K. warns of security concerns in several areas, advises travelers staying during COVID-19 outbreak
- French Polynesia: Air Tahiti cuts several domestic routes because of COVID-19
- **Croatia**: Government will reintroduce mandatory 14-day quarantine for visitors from Bosnia, Kosovo, North Macedonia and Serbia because of COVID-19
- **Kosovo**: Official Travel Advice: U.K. warns against nonessential travel to some municipalities, advises travelers staying during COVID-19 outbreak, reports airport reopens 28 June
- U.K.: Update: Jet2 to cancel summer flights in 2020, 2021 because of COVID-19 outbreak
- Belgium, France, U.K.: Update: Eurostar to cancel summer trains in 2020, 2021 because of COVID-19 outbreak
- Pakistan, United Arab Emirates: Update: Etihad Airways suspends flights from Pakistan because of increasing COVID-19 cases
- Pakistan, United Arab Emirates: Update: Flydubai temporarily suspends flights from Pakistan because of growing of COVID-19 cases
- U.S.: Update: Connecticut, New Jersey, New York states to require visitors from COVID-19 hot spots to quarantine for 14 days
- Canada: Update: Declaration of Emergency extended in Ontario until 15 July
- Canada: Update: British Columbia extends state of emergency until 7 July

• Australia: Update: Qantas to cancel international flights except to New Zealand until mid-2021 amid COVID-19 pandemic
