ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines status may change at any given time without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Extra information:

IATA prepared some leaflets for travelers that might need some extra confidence before they feel assured to travel safely again. Perhaps these are interesting to share with your travelers, for those that might still be a bit hesitant to travel.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

- **Austria:** Innsbruck Airport resumes operations; Austrian Airlines will increase daily flights from July
- **Norway:** Government will lift travel restrictions to, from European countries that respect certain criteria regarding their COVID-19 situation from 15 July

AFRICA:

- **Sierra Leone:** U.S. Embassy reports restrictions on inter-district travel lifted, curfew hours reduced

- **Cote d'Ivoire:** International flights to resume 1 July, domestic flights 26 June

MIDDLE EAST:

- No new updates

AMERICAS:

- **Caribbean:** Security Message: U.S. Consulate reports reopening of commercial airline services to the U.S. from some islands
- **Guyana:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports flights available to New York City on 1 July, Miami on 2 July; airspace closed to arrivals until 2 July

ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- **Maldives:** Government will reopen borders, allow resumption of international tourism from 15 July
- **Bangladesh:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports resumption of limited international commercial flights
- **Australia:** Tasmania's government to open state to interstate travelers 24 July

AIRLINES:

- **Italy, Serbia:** **Air Serbia** plans to resume flights between countries in July
- **Mexico, U.S.:** Update: **VivaAerobus** resumes flights to several U.S. destinations from July
- **Egypt:** Update: **EgyptAir** will resume flights to dozens of destinations from first week of July
- **Nigeria:** Update: **Dana Air** braces for resumption of flights
- **Asia, Europe, North America, South America:** Update: **Aeromexico** increasing international, domestic flights after COVID-19 related suspensions

TRAINS:

- **Europe:** International train services resume at **Prague rail station**
- **France, Spain:** High-speed services between countries will resume from 1 July
- **Morocco:** Al-Boraq high-speed rail services resume

Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

- **Mozambique:** Official Travel Advice: U.K. warns of security concerns, advises travelers staying during COVID-19 outbreak, provides other information on country
- **Nigeria:** Official Travel Advice: U.K. warns of security concerns, advises travelers staying during COVID-19 outbreak, provides other information on country
- **Saudi Arabia:** Official Travel Advice: U.K. warns of security concerns, advises travelers staying during COVID-19 outbreak, provides other information on country
- **Georgia:** Resumption of regular flights delayed until the end of July
- **Turkey:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reminds travelers of weekend curfew, reports other COVID-19-related updates
- **Portugal:** Update: Several areas in **Lisbon** to return to COVID-19 lockdown
