## ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines <u>status may change at any given time</u> without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and guarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

## Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

#### **EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:**

- Morocco, Spain: Update: Spanish government plans to reopen its borders with Morocco on 1 July;
- Global: Update: **EU** set to reopen external borders to nationals from 14 countries starting 1 July
- U.K.: Commercial passenger flights set to resume at Cardiff Airport

#### AFRICA:

- Zambia: International airports reopen as government eases some COVID-19 restrictions
- South Africa: Update: More local airports will be allowed to operate domestic flights from 1 July
- Nigeria: Update: Federal Government approves resumption of domestic flights
- **Senegal:** Update: President to lift COVID-19 state of emergency and curfew on 30 June; air borders to open from 15 July

#### MIDDLE EAST:

Kuwait: Update: Commercial flights at Kuwait International Airport will resume from 1 August

#### **AMERICAS:**

- **Dominican Republic**: Update: Government lifts curfew; state of emergency set to end; authorities to allow international tourism to resume; some restrictions continue
- **Barbados:** Update: Government to reopen borders to international travelers, to resume commercial flights at Grantley Adams Airport from 12 July
- Mexico: Update: Mexico City allows metro stations, businesses to reopen amid increasing COVID-19 cases

#### ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- Sri Lanka: Update: Government lifts COVID-19 lockdown
- Thailand: Update: Aviation authorities will lift ban on international flights on 1 July
- India: Passenger flight services resume in Manipur

#### **AIRLINES**:

- Netherlands, Tanzania: Update: KLM expected to resume flights between countries from 1 July
- France, United Arab Emirates: Air France will resume flights between countries from 1 July
- Mexico, U.S.: Update: Interjet announces reactivation of flights into Cancun
- Denmark, Norway, U.K.: Update: Norwegian Air to resume U.K. short-haul flights from 1 July
- Germany: Update: Lufthansa to resume more flights after suspension because of COVID-19
- Croatia, Ireland, U.K.: Update: Ryanair to resume flights from Ireland, U.K. to Croatia from 1 July
- Egypt, Jordan, Tunisia, United Arab Emirates: **Emirates** to resume flights to Cairo, Tunis and Amman from 1 July
- Europe: Update: Austrian Airlines to offer more summer flights starting in July
- Belgium: Update: Brussels Airlines expands its flight offer in September and October
- Maldives, United Arab Emirates: Update: Emirates to resume passenger flights to Maldives on 16
  July

#### TRAINS:

• Netherlands: Update: NS train services resume normal schedules

### Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

- Pakistan, United Arab Emirates: Update: Some flights canceled as United Arab Emirates' aviation authority temporarily suspends flights from Pakistan
- Morocco, Spain: Update: Morocco expected to keep its borders closed until winter
- Algeria: Update: Land, air and sea borders will remain closed until end of COVID-19 crisis
- Argentina: Update: Government extends, tightens lockdown in, near Buenos Aires following sharp rise in COVID-19 cases
- Myanmar: Update: Government extends visa restrictions, bans on international flights until end of July because of COVID-19
- Kazakhstan: Update: President orders fresh tightening of COVID-19 curbs
- **Germany:** Update: Authorities in North Rhine-Westphalia will extend lockdown in one of two districts affected by outbreak of COVID-19
- Greece, Sweden, U.K.: Update: Greek government extends ban on direct flights arriving from Britain and Sweden, pushing it back to 15 July
- Canada: Update: Porter Airlines extends suspension of all its flights until end of August
- Israel: Israir will halt service to Eilat for as long as international flights are canceled
- U.K.: Authorities order lockdown in Leicester because of COVID-19 infection rate
- Japan bans entry to travelers from 18 countries starting 1 July amid COVID-19 pandemic
- Honduras: Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports curfew extended until 12 July because of COVID-19; new vehicle circulation restrictions implemented
- Australia: Update: Government orders lockdown of 36 Melbourne suburbs; requests flights to divert to other states following increase in COVID-19 cases
- Australia: Update: South Australia cancels reopening of state borders planned for 20 July because
  of increase in COVID-19 cases in Victoria
