ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines status may change at any given time without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

- **Czech Republic:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports Czech Rails and international air carriers resume services, foreigners permitted to remain in country until 17 July
- **Europe:** Update: French government will lift border restrictions for European travel from 15 June

AFRICA:

- **Egypt:** Update: Government will allow scheduled international flights, foreign tourists to some coastal areas from 1 July

MIDDLE EAST:

No updates.

AMERICAS:

- **Belize:** Update: Government to relax curfew; state of emergency to end 30 June

ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- **Japan:** Nagoya's Chubu Airport set to resume some international flights

AIRLINES:

- **Europe, Turkey: Update: SunExpress** restarts international flights between Turkey, several European cities
- **Malaysia: Malindo Air** to resume all domestic flights from 12 June
- **Asia:** Update: **Vietnam Airlines** expects to resume international flights in July
- **Europe:** Update: Six airlines confirm direct connections between **Malta** International Airport and 17 European airports
- **Italy:** Update: **Alitalia** will resume international flights from Milan starting July
- **Australia:** Update: **Virgin Australia** to add hundreds of domestic flights by 6 July as COVID-19 restrictions ease
- **Asia, Europe, Turkey, U.S.: Update: Turkish Airlines** resumes flights to Britain, Germany and the Netherlands, will resume additional international flights from 19 June
- **Canada:** Update: **Air Transat** to resume flights from 23 July
- **Thailand:** Update: Thai Airways International will resume international flights on 37 routes starting 1 August; Lion Air will resume operations of all domestic routes on 19 June
- **Global:** Update: **Air France** to serve nearly 150 destinations during summer holiday period

Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

- **Chile:** Update: Government issues quarantine order for several communes in Santiago area, Vina del Mar, Valparaiso
- **Kazakhstan:** Update: Government locks down several towns following spike in fresh COVID-19 cases
- **Armenia:** Update: Government extends state of emergency until 13 July, plans to permit resumption of international flights from mid-July
