ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines status may change at any given time without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

- **Greece, U.K.:** Flights between countries to fully resume on 15 July
- **U.K.:** Flights between Newquay and Heathrow airports to resume on 24 July with British Airways

AFRICA:

- **Kenya:** President announces phased re-opening of country from COVID-19 lockdown, lifting restrictions in, out of Nairobi and Mombasa from 6 July,
- **Kenya:** Domestic air travel set to resume on 15 July; international flights expected to resume on 1 August

MIDDLE EAST:

- **No updates.**

AMERICAS:

- **U.S.:** New York City enters third phase of reopening

- **Puerto Rico:** Country will be reopened for in-bound tourism on 15 July; health screenings will be enhanced

ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- **no updates**

AIRLINES:

- Egypt, United Arab Emirates: **Air Arabia** Abu Dhabi to resume operations to Alexandria and Sohag on 14 July
- American Samoa, U.S.: **Hawaiian Airlines** will resume most of its mainland U.S. routes on 1 August; flights to Pago Pago will resume on 6 August
- Seychelles, United Arab Emirates: **Air Seychelles** will operate flights from Seychelles to Dubai International Airport throughout July
- Canada, Ireland: **Air Canada** resumes passenger flights between Dublin and Toronto
- Europe: **Scandinavian Airlines** to resume flights between Oslo and some European cities from 16 July
- Canada, Greece: **Air Transat** to resume flights to Athens from 27 July
- Albania, U.K.: **Air Albania** to resume flights to London on 26 July
- South Korea, Vietnam: **T'way Airlines** plans to resume one-way flights from Vietnam to South Korea on 22 July
- Nigeria: **Overland Airways** to resume flights from 15 July
- Global: **Etihad Airways** to increase flight network to 58 destinations by August as COVID-19 restrictions continue to ease

Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

- **India:** Update: Authorities extend ban on international flights until 31 July. Flights from six cities, including
- **Guyana:** Airspace closed to all international arrivals through July because of COVID-19
- **Samoa:** Government extends COVID-19 state of emergency for another month
- **Marshall Islands:** Government extends ban on inbound travel until 5 August
- **Israel:** Some restrictions reimposed to fight **a spike in COVID-19 infections**; bars, nightclubs closed; diners at restaurants and bus passengers will be limited
- **Australia:** **XPT train** service from Sydney to Melbourne suspended because of border closure to limit spread of COVID-19
- **U.S.:** **Miami** authorities order closure of restaurant dining rooms amid COVID-19 fears
- **Australia:** Government imposes **six-week lockdown in Melbourne** from 8 July because of COVID-19

AIRLINES

- Australia: **Qantas, Jetstar** to reduce Sydney-Melbourne flights following closure of New South Wales-Victoria border
- India: **Vistara** expects to resume international flights by end of year
- New Zealand: **Air New Zealand** puts on hold new bookings of international flights into the country on government's request
