ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and other countries still extend or expand their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines status may change at any given time without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

- No updates

AFRICA:

- **Gambia:** Update: Government relaxes travel restrictions, plans to open some nonessential places; Banjul International Airport will reopen no later than 31 October

MIDDLE EAST:

- **United Arab Emirates:** Ras Al Khaimah International Airport will resume scheduled passenger flights from 15 October
- **Israel:** Update: Authorities to ease nationwide lockdown restrictions from 18 October

AMERICAS:

- **Panama:** Update: Tocumen International Airport in Panama City reopens for international flights; COVID-19 screening required
- **Argentina:** Update: Possible return of commercial flights on weekends after months of standstill caused by COVID-19 pandemic
- **Cuba:** Update: Government relaxes COVID-19 restrictions; airports reopen across island except in Havana

ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- **Iraq, Iran:** Flights between countries resume after two-week suspension
- **Philippines:** Direct international flights resume to, from Davao International Airport

AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- **Germany, Poland: Lufthansa** will resume flights between Katowice and Frankfurt from 25 October
- **Caribbean: LIAT** expected to resume flights in November
- **Netherlands, Tanzania: KLM Royal Dutch Airlines** will add flights to Zanzibar from 10 December, reduce services between Amsterdam, Dar es Salaam, Kilimanjaro
- **United Arab Emirates: Air Arabia** will resume flights to Kyiv from 25 October
- **Europe, Israel, U.S.:** Update: **El Al Israel Airlines** to resume more passenger flights to Europe, U.S. next week
- **South Africa, United Arab Emirates: Emirates Airlines** to resume commercial flights at King Shaka International Airport

Areas, airlines & airports imposing further restrictions

AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- **Europe, Morocco: EasyJet** cuts seven destinations from Belfast International Airport; 10 delayed until 2021
- **Cameroon:** Update: **Camair-Co** delays resumption of flights until 16 October
- **Serbia, United Arab Emirates: Etihad Airways** will temporarily suspend operations between Abu Dhabi and Belgrade until 25 November
- **U.K.:** Flights canceled as COVID-19 delays new **Wizz Air** routes from Doncaster Sheffield Airport
- **Portugal, Spain, U.K.: Jet2** suspends flights to Alicante, Malaga and Faro until 2021 amid ongoing COVID-19 pandemic
- **Canada:** Update: **Porter Airlines** extends flight suspension to 15 December

AREAS & AIRPORTS:

- **Honduras:** Update: Government extends national COVID-19 curfew until 18 October
- **Kyrgyz Republic:** Update: Curfew, ban on rallies, travel restrictions imposed until 19 October as president declares new state of emergency
- **China:** Domestic travelers to, from Shanghai face mandatory 14-day quarantine amid COVID-19 concerns
- **Ukraine:** Update: Government extends lockdown until 31 December
- **Israel, United Arab Emirates:** Direct flights between countries postponed until January because of COVID-19
- **Venezuela:** Update: Aviation authority extends ban on passenger flights until 12 November
- **Qatar:** Update: Quarantine rules extended for travelers to 31 December
