ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and other countries still extend or expand their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines <u>status may change at any</u> <u>given time</u> without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Important Message: Covid19 PCR and IgM anti body tests required for ALL passengers to China. Please note. All Passengers transiting to China via connecting flights must take the first COVID-19 PCR and IgM antibody tests within 2 days of boarding **in the country of departure and then take both tests again in the transit country.**

- **Costa Rica**: Update: Country reopens its borders to international flights
- **Dominican Republic, Iran, Mexico, Turkey, Venezuela**: Update: Venezuelan authorities to resume international flights to four countries
- **Chile**: Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports changes in COVID-19 quarantine measures from 5 November

• U.S.: Flights between California's Mineta San Jose International Airport and Hawaii resume

- Bahrain, Maldives: Gulf Air will resume its direct flights to, from Male's Velana International Airport
- Colombia, Panama: Update: Copa Airlines resumes flights between Colombia and Tocumen
 International Airport
- Canada: Air Canada Rouge resumes flights after suspension because of COVID-19

Areas, airlines & airports imposing further restrictions

AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- **U.K.:** Update: **EasyJet** plans to cancel hundreds of flights from London Gatwick Airport amid second lockdown announcement
- U.K.: Update: TUI Airways suspends flights departing from England and Wales from 5 November to 2 December because of lockdowns
- South Africa, U.S.: Delta Air Lines postpones flights between countries until January 2021
- Australia, U.S.: Update: Qantas suspends flights between countries until at least October 2021 because of COVID-19
- Asia, Europe: Update: Turkmenistan Airlines extends suspension of flights until 31 December because of COVID-19
- Asia, Europe, Middle East: Update: Biman Bangladesh Airlines cancels flights on five international routes until 30 November
- U.S.: Update: American Airlines cuts its December schedule by nearly 50 percent
- **Europe**: Update: **Belavia** extends suspension of air travel to Riga, Tallinn and Larnaca until 14 December
- **Cyprus**, **Greece**, **U.K.:** Update: **Jet2** will suspend flights from Leeds Bradford Airport to Crete, Rhodes, Larnaca, Paphos until 2021

AREAS & AIRPORTS:

- **Greece**: Update: Flights will be suspended as government imposes two-week lockdown in Thessaloniki and Serres to contain resurgence in COVID-19 cases
- U.K.: Update: New lockdown bans England residents from traveling abroad from 5 November to 2 December
- U.K.: Update: Welsh government announces new COVID-19 rules from 9 November
- American Samoa, U.S.: Update: Commercial flights from Hawaii to American Samoa suspended until 30 November
- U.S.: Three states added to Washington D.C.'s COVID-19 self-quarantine list
- Greece: Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports expansion of COVID-19 restrictions
- **Cape Verde**: Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports 'state of calamity' extended for Fogo and Santiago islands until 14 November, other islands remain under 'state of contingency'
- Honduras: Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports national curfew extended until 8 November
- **Canada**: Government announces new COVID-19 rules for visitors entering the country from 21 November

- **Guinea**: Official Travel Advice: U.S. advises caution, reconsider travel because of civil unrest, updates its information on COVID-19 in country
- **DR Congo**: Security Message: U.S. Embassy updates its information on entry and exit requirements, COVID-19 testing at airport
- U.K.: Security Message: U.S. Mission reports travel restrictions put into effect because of COVID-19
