ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines status may change at any given time without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

- **Europe:** Latvian government relaxes restrictions on flights to most European countries starting from 3 September

AFRICA:

- **Egypt, Maldives, Russia, United Arab Emirates:** Update: Russian government authorizes resumption of international flights with Egypt, the Maldives and United Arab Emirates

MIDDLE EAST:

- **Jordan:** Update: Government to allow commercial flights from 8 September amid COVID-19 concerns; travelers must show proof of negative test

AMERICAS:

- **Peru:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports domestic flights resume between Arequipa and Lima
- **Chile, Mexico, Peru, Spain, U.S.:** Update: Peru will resume some international flights, reopen borders to limited group of countries from 1 October

ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- **Global:** Update: Beijing-bound flights from Austria, Cambodia, Canada, Denmark, Greece, Pakistan, Sweden and Thailand will gradually resume operation
- **Asia:** Update: Vietnamese authorities plan to resume international flights to, from six Asian cities from mid-September; 14-day quarantine still required

AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- **China, Indonesia:** Garuda Indonesia resumes flights to China following months of travel restrictions because of COVID-19
- **Denmark, China:** Update: SAS will resume services between Copenhagen, Shanghai from 29 September
- **Bangladesh, Qatar:** Update: Biman Bangladesh Airlines will resume flights to Doha
- **Nepal, Turkey:** Update: Turkish Airlines resumes Kathmandu-Istanbul connections

Areas, airlines & airports imposing further restrictions

AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- **Asia, Europe:** Update: Suspension of Turkmenistan Airlines international flights extended until 30 September
- **Greece, U.K.:** Travelers from Zante to Wales told to self-isolate; TUI cancels flights to Laganas
- **Europe:** Update: Wizz Air to suspend service to Slovenia, several routes to Bosnia and Herzegovina, Germany and Sweden from 25 October 2020 until 30 March 2021 amid COVID-19 restrictions; suspension of several other services extended
- **Saudi Arabia:** Update: Saudi Arabian Airlines' international flights will remain suspended 'until further notice'
- **U.S.:** American Airlines to cut over 80,000 flights in October

AREAS & AIRPORTS:

- **Iran, Turkey:** Update: Turkish authorities postpone resumption of Iran flights until 2 October
- **South America:** Update: Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Peru extend border closures amid COVID-19 pandemic
- **Greece, Russia:** Greek government to require COVID-19 tests to visitors from Russia between 7-21 September
- **British Virgin Islands:** Governor introduces two-week curfew to help prevent spread of COVID-19
- **Australia:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports New South Wales will extend border region with Victoria on 4 September to prevent spread of COVID-19
- **Myanmar:** Government imposes mandatory quarantine, COVID-19 test for visitors to Naypyitaw
- **Malaysia:** Update: Government to refuse entry to long-term immigration pass holders from countries reporting more than 150,000 COVID-19 cases
- **Australia:** Government will extend its restrictions on cruise ships entering country, ban on overseas travel for another three months
- **Europe:** Update: Norway revises its COVID-19 restrictions
- **Chile:** Update: State of catastrophe extended until 25 September because of COVID-19
- **Cape Verde:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports "State of Calamity" extended until 31 October because of COVID-19
- **New Zealand:** Update: Government extends COVID-19 restrictions until at least 15 September
