## ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines status may change at any given time without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

### Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

#### EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

- **Ireland:** Update: Government to drop 14-day COVID-19 quarantine requirement for travelers arriving from 15 countries.

#### AFRICA:

- **Nigeria:** Update: Flight operations resume at Kaduna International Airport.

#### MIDDLE EAST:

- **Qatar:** Update: Government allows citizens, permanent residents to travel, return anytime from 1 August.

### AMERICAS:

- No update

### ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

- No update

### AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- Sweden, United Arab Emirates: Update: **Emirates** to resume flights to Stockholm from 1 August.
- Rwanda, United Arab Emirates: Update: **RwandAir** will resume services to Dubai on 1 August.
- Hungary, South Korea: Update: **LOT Polish Airlines** resumes its Budapest-Seoul direct route.
- Spain, Turkey, U.K.: Update: **TUI** to resume flights from Glasgow to Spain, Turkey from 1 August.
- Australia: Update: **Regional Express Airlines** resumes flights between Armidale and Sydney.
- Jordan: Update: **Royal Jordanian** to resume flights on Amman-Aqaba route on 23 July.
- China, Netherlands: Update: **KLM** resumes flights to Shanghai.

## Areas, airlines & airports imposing further restrictions

### AIRLINES:

- Georgia, Ukraine: Update: **SkyUp Airlines** cancels some flights to Georgia because of COVID-19.
- Asia, Europe: Update: **Belavia** extends suspension of flights to several destinations.

### AREAS & AIRPORTS:

- **Oman:** Update: Government will ban travel between all governorates from 25 July through 8 August to prevent spread of COVID-19.
- **Panama:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports on international flight suspension, quarantine and curfew.
- **Nigeria:** Update: Government extends closure of airports for international flights until October.
- **Venezuela:** Government will impose seven-day quarantine because of COVID-19 pandemic.
- **El Salvador:** Update: Government will keep airport closed for commercial flights as COVID-19 cases rise.
- **New Caledonia:** Government extends ban on most commercial international flights for three months.
- **Zimbabwe:** Update: President announces curfew from 22 July to combat COVID-19 outbreak.
- **Malaysia:** Update: Government to reimpose compulsory quarantine for returning nationals, foreign visitors from 24 July.
