### ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and other countries still extend or expand their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our 3-weekly update informs you in short about the latest information.

#### Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

##### AREAS & AIRPORTS:

- **Thailand:** Update: International travelers will be allowed to transit country from 1 March after civil aviation authority relaxes COVID-19 measures
- **Global:** Update: Health authorities in **Cyprus** update categorization of countries according to their COVID-19 situation as airports reopen
- **South Africa:** Update: Some land borders remain closed; five international airports will be open as government relaxes COVID-19 restrictions
- **France, U.K.:** Flights from Newcastle International Airport to Paris Charles de Gaulle resume as some COVID-19 restrictions are eased
- **Turkey:** Update: Government will lift weekend lockdowns in low and medium-risk cities, limit restrictions to just Sundays in high and very high-risk cities
- **U.K.:** Several airlines will resume flights from London's Gatwick Airport this summer
- **U.S.:** Governor of Pennsylvania lifts some COVID-19 travel restrictions
- **Zimbabwe:** Update: Inter-city travel expected to resume as authorities ease COVID-19 lockdown
- **India, Seychelles, Uzbekistan:** Passenger flights expected to resume as Indian government forms special arrangement with Seychelles and Uzbekistan

##### AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- **India, Russia:** Update: **Air India** resumes regular flights between Delhi and Moscow's Sheremetyevo International Airport
- **U.S.:** **Delta Air Lines** will resume flights between Rhode Island's T. F. Green Airport and Atlanta's Hartsfield–Jackson Airport from 3 March
- **Vietnam:** Update: **Vietjet Air** will resume flights to Van Don International Airport in Quang Ninh from 3 March; airport reopens 2 March
- **Europe:** **Air Astana** will resume Almaty-Tbilisi flights from 16 March; Georgia resumes air services with several countries
- **Belarus, Georgia:** **Belavia** to resume flights from Minsk to Batumi on 30 March
- **U.S.:** **Delta Air Lines** will resume flights to Nebraska's Lincoln Airport on 26 May

- **Global: Avianca** temporarily suspends 25 international routes because of new COVID-19 travel restrictions in countries

## Areas, airlines & airports imposing further restrictions

### AREAS & AIRPORTS:

- **India:** Authorities in Tamil Nadu extend COVID-19 restrictions until 31 March; international passenger flights remain banned during lockdown period
- **Global:** Update: **Spanish** government extends restrictions on non-essential journeys from countries outside EU and Schengen Area to 31 March
- **Europe:** Update: **French, German** governments will require COVID-19 test for some border crossings
- **Argentina, Brazil:** Update: Argentina government extends closure of air, land borders with Brazil until 12 March because of COVID-19
- **Global:** Update: Civil aviation authorities in **Iran** suspend flights to, from several countries because of COVID-19
- **Belgium, Italy, Morocco:** Moroccan authorities suspend all passenger flights to, from Belgium and Italy because of COVID-19
- **Brazil, Peru:** Peruvian government extends suspension of flights from Brazil until 14 March
- **Australia:** Update: Government extends international travel ban, border closure until 17 June because of COVID-19 variants
- **Germany:** Update: Government plans to extend COVID-19 lockdown until 28 March, **ease some restrictions from week of 8 March**
- **Europe, Peru:** Update: Passenger flights from Europe to Peru suspended until 14 March because of COVID-19
- **Canada:** Lockdown restrictions imposed on Prince Edward Island until 4 March because of COVID-19

### AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- **Canada:** Update: **Porter Airlines** delays resumption of flights until 19 May
- **Croatia, Portugal:** **TAP Portugal** delays resumption of flights between Lisbon and Zagreb until 2 June
- **U.K.:** **TUI** cancels all flights until 17 May because of COVID-19 lockdown
