ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and some countries still extend their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our daily update informs you in short about the latest information.

Please note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines <u>status may change at any given time</u> without prior notice. The enlisted information is based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and guarantine measures, updated via our ATPI Alerts.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

AFRICA:

MIDDLE EAST:

- Oman: Government will lift ban on travel between governorates from 8 August;
- Middle East: Saudi Arabia reopens its land borders with United Arab Emirates, Kuwait, Bahrain;
 flights resume

AMERICAS:

Canada, Caribbean, U.S.: Airlines to resume flights to Caribbean destinations as borders reopen.

ASIAN / AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

• India: Flight operations will be suspended in Bagdogra, Kolkata on 5, 8, 20, 21, 27, 28, 31 August as lockdown dates change in West Bengal

AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- Global: Copa Airlines in Panama will resume international flights to eight countries from 14 August
- Germany, U.K.: Lufthansa resumes flights from Birmingham Airport
- Pakistan, U.K.: Pakistan International Airlines to resume flights to U.K. on 14 August
- Canada: Central Mountain Air to offer direct flight from Kamloops to Vancouver from 9 August

Areas, airlines & airports imposing further restrictions

AIRLINES:

- Australia: Tigerair Australia ceases operations because of low demand, transfers credits for use on Virgin Australia operated flights
- Croatia, Greece: Aegean Airlines will halt all flights to Croatia for rest of year

AREAS & AIRPORTS:

- U.K.: Lockdown measures will be reimposed in Aberdeen area after spike in COVID-19 cases
- Gambia: Government temporarily closes non-essential public places for 90 days because of COVID-19
- Australia: Queensland will close its border to all of New South Wales, ACT from 8 August
- **Spain, Switzerland: Swiss** health authorities add Spain with exception of islands to its list of countries from which people arriving must enter 10-day quarantine period
- Maldives: New restrictions imposed on travel into, out of Greater Male region
- Oman: full lockdown of Dhofar governorate will be maintained until further notice
- Morocco: Government will reimpose lockdown measures in Fez and Tangier-Asilah provinces starting 5 August
- **Uruguay:** U.S. Embassy in Montevideo has suspended some consular services, reports repatriation flights currently available 8, 15 August
- U.S.: New York City will put up quarantine checkpoints to curb COVID-19
- Belgium, Germany: German authority warns against all nonessential travel to Antwerp because of COVID-19
- Afghanistan, Iran, Turkey: Turkey suspends all flights to Afghanistan, Iran until 1 September
- India: Authorities extend lockdown in Budgam until 10 August
- Tonga: Government extends state of emergency until 31 August because of COVID-19
- India: Curfew declared in parts of Assam's Sonitpur district following communal clash
- Gambia: Government imposes three-week curfew after COVID-19 cases surge
- Japan: State of emergency declared at Aichi Prefecture amid COVID-19 concerns
- **Belgium, U.K.:** British government reportedly to impose 14-day quarantine on arrivals from Belgium following increase in COVID-19 cases
