ATPI Alerts Travel Opportunities per Country during Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

The world is still changing by the hour during this COVID pandemic outbreak. Many travel bans are being eased or lifted and other countries still extend or expand their current travel bans. Airlines slowly start up their network again, although with lower capacity. Our 3-weekly update informs you in short about the latest information.

Entry restrictions UK

General requirements:

Health declaration form - a QR code will be generated upon completion and this will be asked in the check-in counter.

If the traveler has been in or through a country on the banned travel list (RED list), quarantine is required in a managed quarantine hotel for 10 days. COVID test package should also be availed where it will be used on or before day 2 and on or after day 8 of quarantining.

Seafarers

- COVID test is not required but ensure to show proof of being a seafarer eg. Seafarer's Identification Document (SID) or Seaman's Book.
- Quarantine is not required as long as crew will embark the vessel within 2 days.

Offshore

- Negative PCR or LAMP test 3 days before arrival in England
- Quarantine for 10 days in a place you're staying. If travelling from or through a red list country, quarantine should be in a managed quarantine hotel.
- COVID test package should be availed.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

AREAS & AIRPORTS:

- **Australia, New Zealand:** Update: Quarantine-free travel between countries reinstated after Auckland's hot-spot status removed
- **Greece, U.K.:** Update: Flights between countries expected to resume from 14 May

- **Global:** Update: French government will ease COVID-19 restrictions on some international travel
- **Saudi Arabia:** Update: Aviation authority confirms international airports will resume normal operations from 17 May

AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- **U.S.:** **American Airlines** will resume direct flights from Northwest Arkansas National Airport to Miami and Washington, D.C., in April
- **Libya, Tunisia:** **Tunisair** will resume flights to Libya in April
- **Israel, U.S.:** Update: **United Airlines** will resume flights to Israel
- **Georgia, India, Uzbekistan:** Update: **Uzbekistan Airways** resumes flights from Tashkent to Delhi and Tbilisi
- **Israel, South Africa:** Update: **El Al Airlines** will restore flights to South Africa
- **Canada:** **Air Canada** will resume flights to British Columbia's Prince Rupert Regional Airport from 22 June
- **Netherlands, UK, South America, South Africa, Panama:** Update: **KLM** will resume flights to the UK on 15 March. Flight ban for all passengers to/from South Africa, Panama and South America will be lifted from 1st April.

Areas, airlines & airports imposing further restrictions

AREAS & AIRPORTS:

- **France:** Update: Authorities extend weekend lockdown in Dunkirk for three weeks
- **Cambodia:** Government halts travel to, from Chrey Thom area in Kandal province because of COVID-19; other restrictions continue in country
- **Japan:** Update: Airlines partly suspend bookings on flights from abroad after government's request to limit number of inbound passengers
- **Philippines:** Authorities impose lockdown in several areas of Manila, including some hotels; Quezon City government reports restrictions because of COVID-19
- **Mauritius:** Update: Flights suspended for two weeks as COVID-19 lockdown imposed
- **France:** Update: Government extends weekend lockdown in Nice, French Riviera region; may consider lifting measure during third weekend of March
- **Spain:** Regions reach agreement to restrict travel during Easter week, except for Madrid; lockdown in some areas includes St Joseph Day holiday weekend
- **Poland:** Update: Hotels will close as government reintroduces COVID-19 restrictions in Lubuskie and Mazowieckie regions
- **Portugal:** Update: Government approves 15-day extension of state of emergency; lockdown restrictions expected to be eased
- **Portugal, Spain:** Update: Land border between countries to remain closed to fight spread of COVID-19

AIRLINES / TRAIN:

- No updates.
